Spread of	Staff		Staff can apply for a PCR test if they have symptoms via the government website and are encouraged to do so. Where the staff member tests negative, they can return to work. Staff are kept up to date with national guidance about the signs, symptoms and transmission of COVID-19. Management to be vigilant and if any staff display signs of being unwell with possible COVID-19 symptoms they must be sent home immediately. If another member of staff has helped someone with COVID-19 symptoms they do not need to go home unless they develop symptoms themselves. The staff member will wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds after any contact with someone who is unwell.
